Attendance and punctuality

Last year, we almost met our attendance target of 96%, with 95.7%. However, this is still one of the lowest figures in the borough and we would like to improve it further this year. We understand that children do fall ill from time to time but will be monitoring everyone's attendance figures at the end of half term and sending out a note to all those parents whose children have attendance below 95%. This is just to keep you informed as parents are often unaware of what their child's attendance is. The attendance and lateness figures for the term so far are:

School Foyer squeeze

A number of parents have asked recently if the meat we use in school is halal. The catering contract was reviewed and updated recently and I can confirm that this will not include serving halal meat. However, there are daily vegetarian options should children wish to choose these.
