A crossing for St John's?

A number of parents have expressed their concern at the dangers our children face when trying to cross the road outside the school gates at the start and end of the day. Lots of cars are now driving along Pemberton Gardens at speed as a cut through route between Holloway and Junction Roads and the bus traffic in and out of the bus garage only adds to the volume of vehicles. Quite a few parents have also begun to park their cars outside the school on the yellow zig-zag lines while they drop off their children, making the congestion worse.

We have asked Islington Council for a pedestrian crossing on several occasions but each time have been turned down as we don't meet their "criteria". We know the parents, staff and governors feel very strongly that it is only a matter of time before a serious accident happens. We are therefore planning to take our appeal further and will ask parents to support us with a petition early next term. In the meantime, if you can avoid parking
