Attendance and punctuality

A number of families have also requested time out of school during term time. We have very strict guidance from the local authority to ensure absence is only authorised in exceptional circumstances. Where it is not approved, families may face a penalty fine or court action so please discuss any planned absence with us in advance so that you know whether it will be approved or not.
