<p><b>Minutes of meeting:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. We discussed the role of school councillors- to gather the views of their classmates on certain issues and support the school with a range of events. We agreed that the chair will be Ibrahim, vice chair will be Zyon, secretary (clerk) will be Lilly Rose and the treasurer will be Talya. We gave a special welcome to our new school councillors- Jorja and Kasra</li> <li>2. Each class had discussed which clubs they would most like. Year 3 had done a special ballot so that everyone had a fair vote – good democracy in practice! The most popular clubs were: Year 3 – cookery, art and craft, drama, games and science plus some sports clubs including gymnastics, basketball, cricket and dodgeball Year 4 – cookery, arts and craft, construction, dodgeball Year 5 – hadn't discussed or voted so were going to do so after lunch and feedback to Mr Welsh Year 6 – maths, cricket, mixed sports, pottery, drama and hall games Year 2 – initial thoughts were for science club We also talked about the upcoming science week from 10<sup>th</sup>-14<sup>th</sup> February and what would be taking place including mad science, scientist mufti, family team challenge event plus lots of visitors. More info to follow.</li> <li>3. We discussed the visit from Andy Chrich and the work of CARIS. We agreed to focus on what we can do to support the homeless charity at our next meeting.</li> <li>4. We discussed the new 'staggered' playtimes and nearly all feedback was positive with children saying there is much more space and less accidents. They also thought a staggered lunchtime may be good but Lilly Rose did raise the issue that some older children will then never have a chance to play with the younger ones.</li> </ol>
