#### Dear Parents,

I just wanted to start off by sending you all our prayers and best wishes during what is an extremely difficult period for so many of our families. As you already know, it appears schools will be closed for quite some time to all pupils apart from those whose parents are critical workers or those from vulnerable families. We know children generally learn best when they are in school so it is extremely difficult when we have to say we cannot accept additional pupils, even though we know circumstances at home may be very challenging. We hope that by sticking closely to the rules and minimising the opportunities for the virus to spread amongst pupils in school, the infection rate may start to fall and children can once again be back in school with their friends.

### Remote learning

Each week, teachers set tasks for children to complete via Seesaw. The weekly timetable helps to show which days they should be



completed on. We know that this can be difficult if parents are working from home or if children need to share computers or other devices with siblings. Please just do the best **you can.** If you are struggling to complete everything, please focus on the basics such as reading every day with your child and completing as much of the English and maths tasks as you can, including using Doodle maths. Teachers are now including short video clips alongside the tasks on Seesaw to explain what the children need to do and model it where possible so we hope this helps. Our teachers have also started to collect pupils work in the home learning journals each week or two and drop off new reading books. We hope that by collecting in the children's work, it will help motivate them to complete the tasks as well as they can. It's also a lovely way to keep in touch with you all! One of the things children miss most about home learning is seeing their friends. Each class has two zoom sessions a week. On Wednesday, the zoom is to catch up on how children are getting on with their learning but also to have fun and play some games. Starting next week, we will also have an achievement assembly each Monday to celebrate all the good things children are doing both at home and school. Early Years, Year 1 and Year 2 will have one at 1:30 and Years 3 to 6 will have one at 2:00pm. Teachers will send out a zoom link beforehand but please make a note in your diary.

We understand that some families will struggle to complete all the home learning if they do not have computers or other devices. If you are unable to access the online learning, please contact the school and we will try our best to support you. Our school website has a number of things on there to provide information and support regarding home learning. 
# Vouchers for those entitled to free school meals
