Dear Parents

Welcome back to the new half term, it was lovely to see so many children and parents in the playground this morning. I hope you all managed to get a break during the holiday and that despite the new lockdown, we all have a successful couple of months ahead.

Covid update

Many of you were asking what the implications of the new lockdown are in terms of school being open. The government has been clear that the level of Covid transmissions in primary schools has been very low and have therefore prioritised schools to remain open. We will however be ensuring that we continue to have measures in place within school to minimise the



risk of transmission such as keeping children in class 'bubbles' and maintaining a regular schedule of handwashing and cleaning. *Can we please remind parents that they need to wear a face covering when dropping off or collecting their children from school* as adults are more likely to transmit the virus than children. To help everyone remember, our Year 2 children put their IT skills to good use by creating some posters about the importance of wearing a mask—we are hoping we may be allowed to also display them on local buses.



So far we have been fortunate to have very few cases of Covid in our school community but obviously if children, parents or staff do test positive, there is a possibility that we will have to close whole classes or even the whole school in the event that a significant number of staff tested positive. We hope that keeping our strict measures in place will ensure the risk of this is low.

The St John's sponsored spellathon!

Just a reminder that children in Years 1 to 6 will be taking part in the sponsored spell on *Friday 13th November*. The children will need lots of practice at home before the big day so will need lots of support from parents and siblings—remember to break the spelling list down and tackle a few words each day until your children are really confident. You should also have received some useful tips on different ways to help your children practice so that it's not too daunting.

On the subject of spelling, our Year 6 children finished a fantastic third in a national spelling competition via Doodlespell. Over 300 schools entered the competition so not surprisingly, they were very proud of their achievement. Well done Year 6!
