## Covid update

Some of you may have heard that a child in Year 4 tested positive for the Covid virus yesterday. Following guidance from the public health team, the whole class will now need to self isolate at home for two weeks. Although there are several siblings in other classes, the guidance is that these children should continue to come in to school. We are asking parents to closely monitor their children for any symptoms of Covid—a high temperature, a new continuous cough or a loss of taste and smell. If your child does show any of these symptoms, please call 111 for further advice and take them for a test if told to do so.

Can I please ask parents to follow the guidance around washing hands regularly, covering your face and maintaining space between yourself and others. It has become very noticeable at the end of the day that an increasing number of parents remain in the playground to chat while their children play in the playground, often with children from other class bubbles. **Can I please ask parents to collect their** 

*children promptly at home time and leave the school straight away.* This will help us to keep the risk of transmission to a minimum. Thank you.
