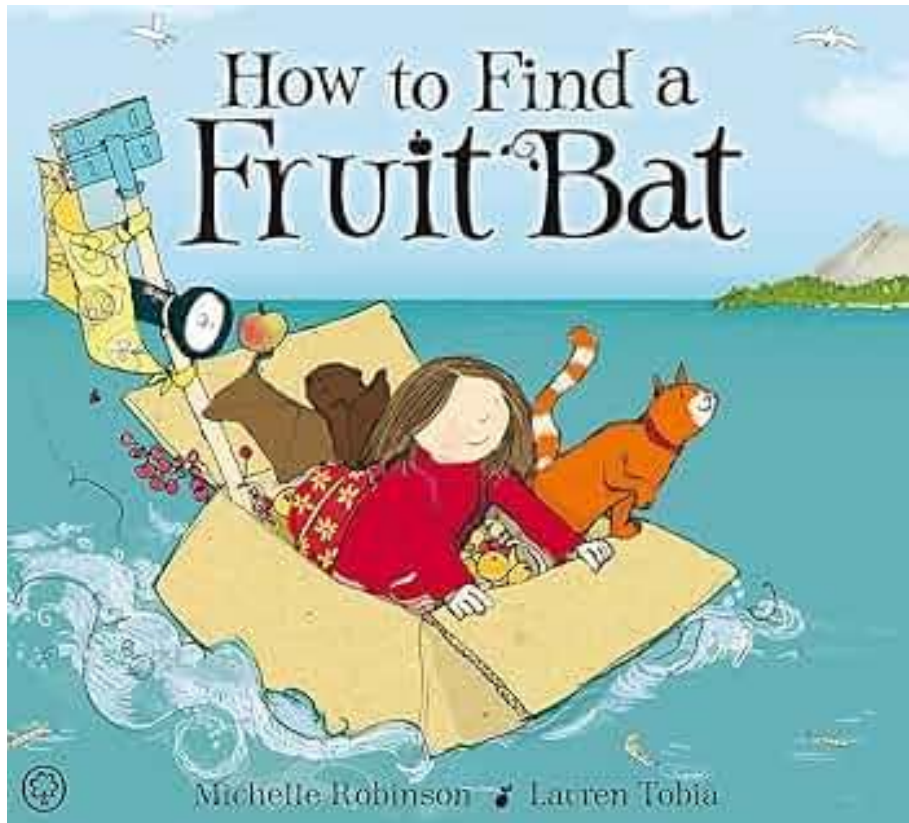


What we have been learning about...

Will it still taste nice?



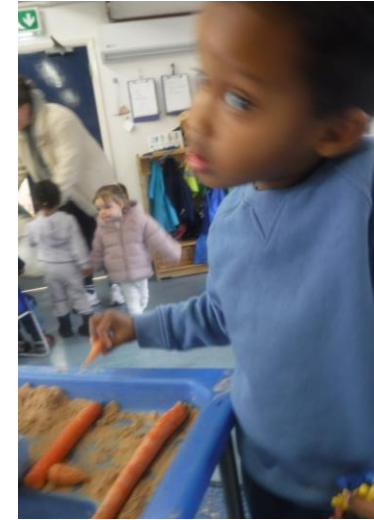
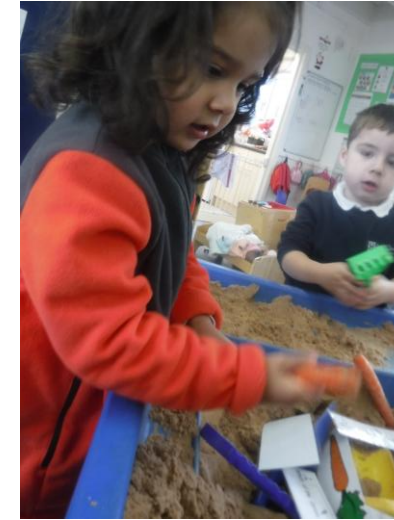
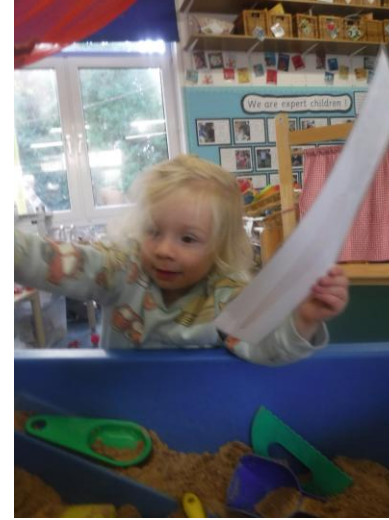
We have been drawing

bat



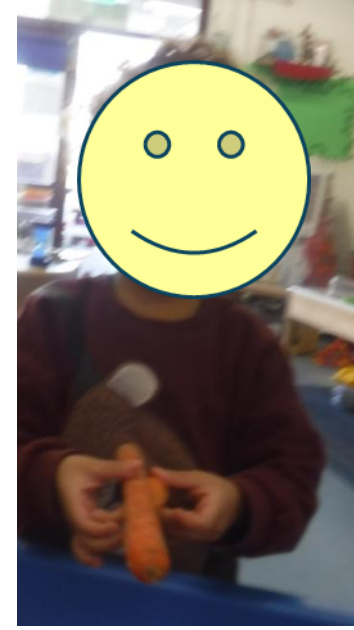


Can you draw the journey the little girl went on? Now she is lost in the jungle!
How will she get back home?

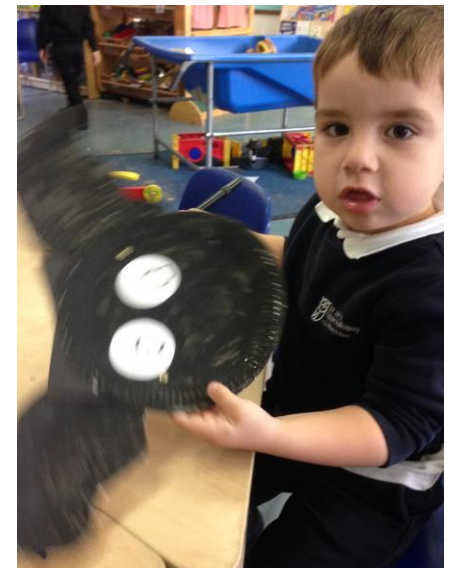
We've been measuring in the sand tray. Could you find a long / short carrot? How do you know? What do you do to help you find out if you are right?

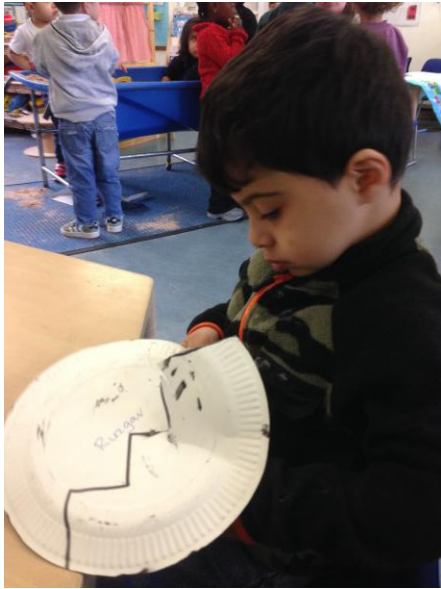


Who found the longest carrot? Which was the shortest?
